The East Coast Zoological Society's second campus will be defined by the ecological treasures we have the responsibility to steward.

East Central Florida is defined by three unique bodies of water: the Atlantic Ocean to the east, the Indian River Lagoon in the middle, and the St. Johns River to the west. These priceless assets fuel our urgency to construct a world-class aquarium on the shores of the Banana River. **The vulnerability of our ecosystem**—the interconnected fates of people, animals, water and vegetation—**is the issue of our time.** It is a matter crucial to this region's future.

Globally, animals are becoming extinct at ever-increasing rates, and more than one-third of marine mammals are threatened. Throughout Florida, we witness the impacts of pollution, chemicals and temperature shifts. The tragic decline of the Indian River Lagoon affects every person in our region and beyond.

The new aquarium complex will allow us to increase marine conservation programs and make the Space Coast an essential tourism, heritage and cultural destination. We will:

our living shoreline efforts and other restoration programs to save the Indian River Lagoon

Develop

innovative programs that show the world how to spark and regenerate ecological thriving

Create

an estimated 900+ jobs and positively impact property values and businesses

Contribute

an \$85+ million annual economic impact

Enhance

our region's ability to attract and retain a high-wage, high-talent workforce

Solutions to our urgent ecological challenges require action today and new approaches for tomorrow. The longer we wait, the more difficult and costlier it will be to recover.

The East Coast Zoological Society, known for our flagship location, Brevard Zoo, is launching the most significant campaign in our history to raise a total of \$100 million over five years. The largest component of our campaign, \$85 million, is to **create a world-class aquarium and conservation center** on 14 acres of shoreline on the Banana River at Port Canaveral.

The vision for the new campus mirrors the distinctive aesthetic of Brevard Zoo, leveraging the beauty and benefits of natural Florida and encountering sea life through a personal, accessible, joyful and relaxed experience. In addition, \$15 million will be dedicated to further amplify Brevard Zoo's impact through our initiatives in conservation, animal wellness, veterinary services and education.

And, by combining forces of the Zoo's current conservation efforts with the new aquarium's programs, we will have a massive impact on our environment and long-term sustainability.

We will ensure our animal residents continue to have the best possible veterinary care and nutrition led by a highly trained and expert staff of professionals. We will use new diagnostic technologies and expand our veterinary internship programs, as well as make innovations in animal management to ensure all of the Zoo's 900+ animals continue to thrive. Our conservation efforts will continue to focus on engaging the community to participate in the conservation and restoration of the Indian River Lagoon. And, we will continue to educate the community on the benefits of spending time in nature to improve human health and wellness.
