"Receiving the award is a major milestone for BIMDA. It is really a tribute to the visionary leadership and loyal members who have contributed immensely to Brevard over the years," says Kurian.

BIMDA was formed in 1996 by Kurian and pediatrician Dr. Mahesh Soni to create a platform for physicians, dentists and other medical scientists of Indian heritage to share ideas and support the availability of medical treatment for those who might not otherwise

have access to it. These core ideals have allowed the organization to not only grow here in Brevard, but also to serve as a model for several other similar Florida-based medical organizations.

In the nearly two decades since BIMDA's inception, its members have supported a wide variety of charitable organizations. They helped raise thousands of dollars for disaster victims in Louisiana, Asia and Haiti. They help support a host of local charities, such as the Merritt Island Rotary Club Foundation, the Brevard Symphony Youth Orchestra, and the Brevard Sheriff's Office's "Camp Chance."

Kurian says that BIMDA has continued to grow largely because the group is a big believer in diversity and inclusion. It's not mandatory to be of Indian descent to join the organization.

Kurian's marketing and

networking skills have proved beneficial in bringing together medical groups across the county. "BIMDA supports an inclusive policy," he says. "While we believe in an independent spirit of enterprise, we look for ways to partner with all medical institutions. Partnership medicine will ultimately benefit patients."

## ■DR. N. RAO **KOPURI ASSUMES ROLE OF PRESIDENT** FOR 2013

In November 2012, BIMDA's members elected a new president to guide their efforts, Dr. N. Rao Kopuri, an orthodontist with Central Florida Orthodontic Specialists.

Kopuri has been a member of the organization since 1996, and over the years has held several board titles with BIMDA. This will be his first year as president.

"I'm very happy to take this position," says Kopuri. "I want to take BIMDA a step higher in its charitable efforts."

Specifically, Dr. Kopuri is interested in not only continuing the group's local philanthropic efforts, but also in branching out further by organizing member missions to bring medical and dental care to some of the world's poorest of nations.

"Every human being deserves food, shelter and health care," says Dr. Kopuri. "There are no boundaries for the poor."

Dr. Kopuri has lived in Brevard since 1986 when his wife, Dr. Aparna Kopuri, a child psychiatrist, was offered a position here and became the first child

Being a part of BIMDA and its charitable endeavors has also given Dr. Kopuri a great deal of joy over the years. "It's really satisfying. You can't buy this kind of satisfaction," he says.
